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Introduction

This qualification is for individuals working in community, home, or residential care settings under supervision as part of a multi-disciplinary team. They follow individualised plans to provide person-centred support to people with ageing, disability, or other needs, taking responsibility for their own work within their role.

The course includes a 120-hour work placement and builds practical and theoretical knowledge required for effective care. Skills are applied according to Australian laws, standards, and codes of practice. Currently, there are no licensing or regulatory requirements for this qualification.

Enrolment Requirements

To enrol in this course, students must:

- Hold a valid USI (Unique Student Identifier).

Course Duration

The Certificate III in Individual Support is delivered over a period of 52 weeks, including 12 weeks of holidays

This course duration includes a combination of workplace-based activities, tasks, workplace based and independent projects, self-study, work placement, and scheduled classroom/workshop sessions.

Face-to-Face 2.5 days per week (20 hours)
